Toxic Soup

"Take a pinch of red phosphorous, a smidggen of ephedrine, a dash of iodine and a skosh of lye.
Add some distilled water and simmer for a few hours and hope it doesn't explode and kill you."

Meth Lab sites are extremely unstable and dangerous. Homes, furnishings, the surrounding land and ground water are easily contaminated. Meth cooking sites are designated as toxic waste sites by state government. Such sites require specialized cleanup and disposal procedures.

For Each pound of meth produced 5 to 6 pounds of toxic waste ar left behind.

Meth cooks often pour leftover chemicals and sludge down drains, in nearby storm drains, or directly onto the ground.

Meth by-products pose a long-term hazard. They can persist in soil and groundwater for years.

Clean-up costs are exorbitant because solvent contaminated soil must often be incinerated.
